
Partnership Technical Assistant Angela Williamson told child care teachers and providers about the Very Important Parents program at the Early Childhood Education Fair June 26.

Make Your Summertime Outing a Blast for Your Children

Summertime is one of the best times for an educational outing with your child. The right kind of summer activities can prompt cognitive and language development.

But even the best plans may result in a day filled with more frustration than enjoyment. Here are some tips for making your summer outings fun for you and your child:



Many factors impact your child's ability to cope in an unfamiliar place.

Where is your child developmentally? A toddler with a strong motor drive may not be a good candidate for a long stroller ride, and a preschooler with nightmares may be upset by a carnival fun house.

Pack the essentials.

Always bring water for

your family. Your child may also need a break during the outing, so bring along nutritional snacks and a favorite toy. This will help ease the transition to a new place with new sights, sounds and people.

Safety first!

Never underestimate the power of the sun — protect your child with sunscreen, hats and cover-ups. Also bring along a small first aid kit with antiseptic wipes, bandages and antibiotic cream.

Bring emergency phone numbers along for easy ac-

cess if you have to use them.

Other tips

- When planning an outing, consider activities from your child's perspective.
- Keep the routine as constant as possible — respect naptimes and feeding times.
- Take the hurry out of outings. Slow down the pace so both you and your child will enjoy the day.

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Know your child's limits.
